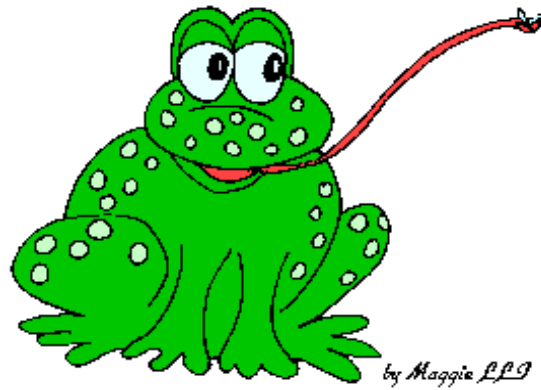


Who am I?

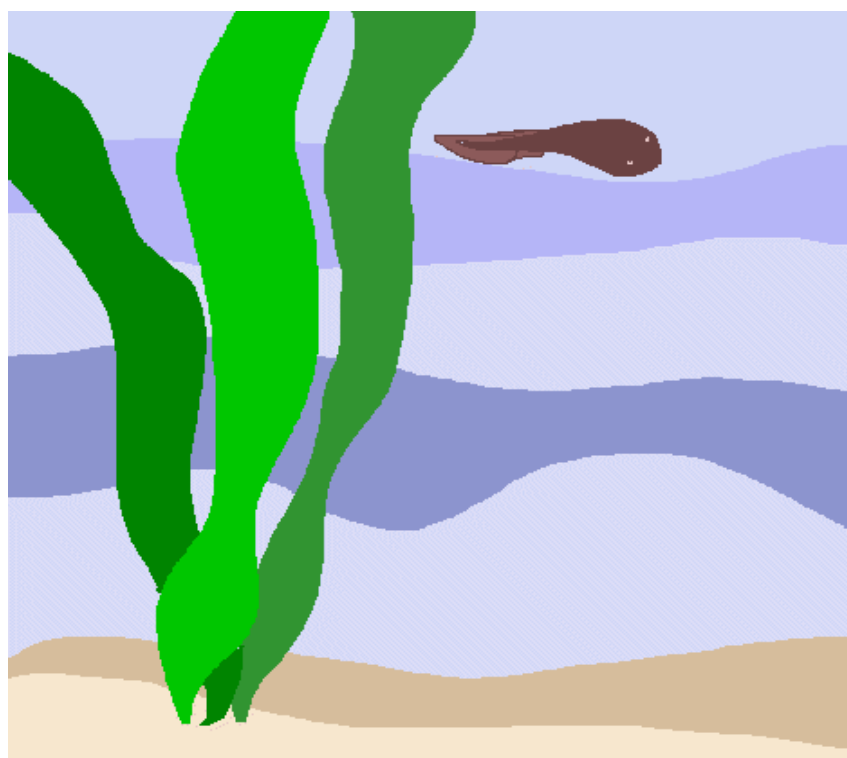

One by one, the tadpoles breakout from their eggs. They swim away to find food.



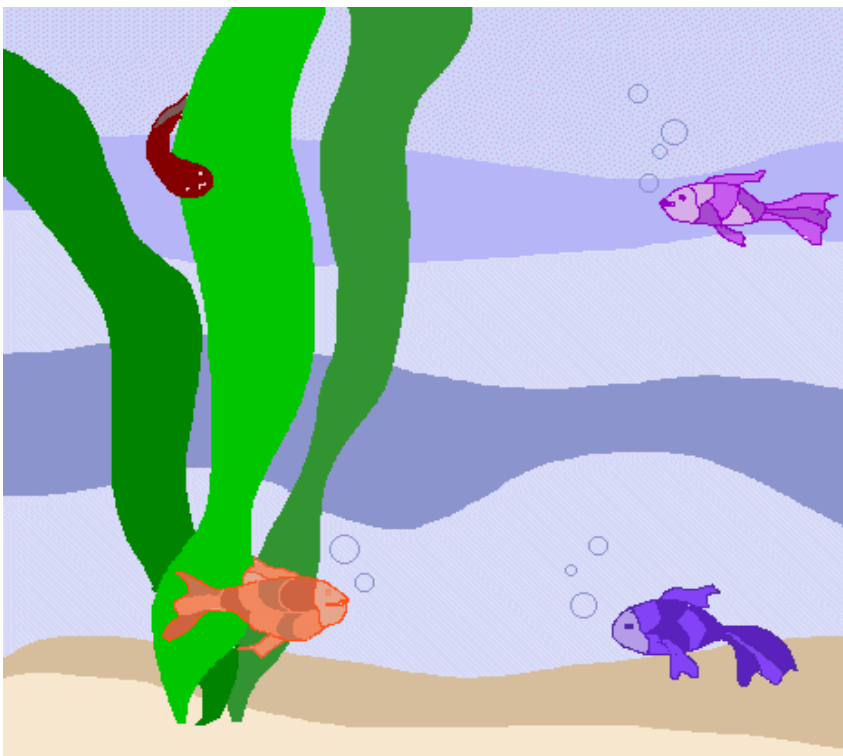
All of the tadpoles are gone except one. He is still trying to get out from the egg.



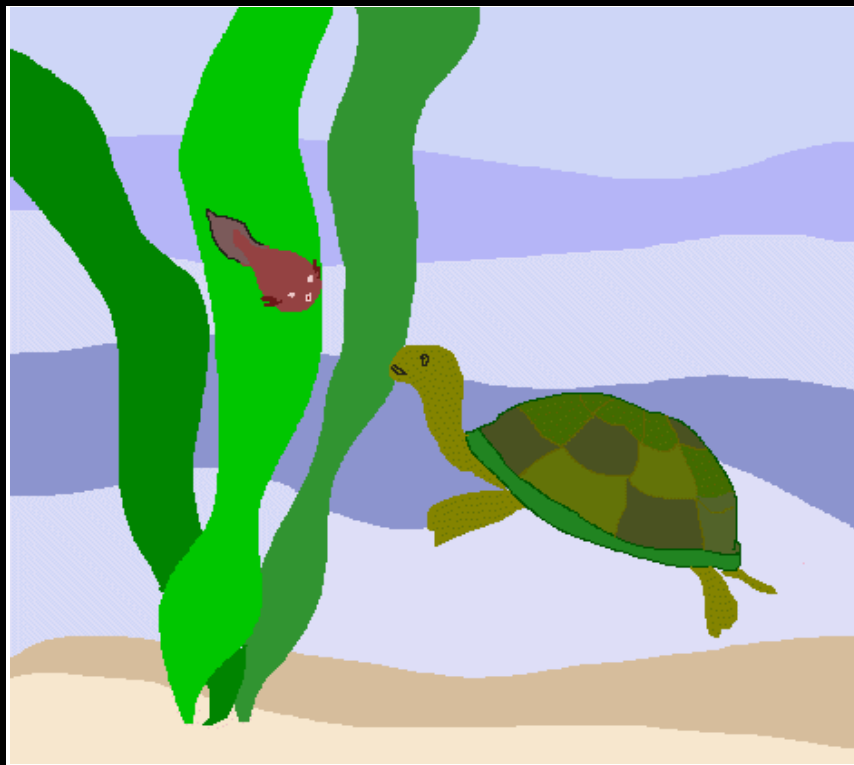
He finally comes out but no one is there. All of his brothers and sisters are nowhere to be seen. He is alone. He tries to look for his family.



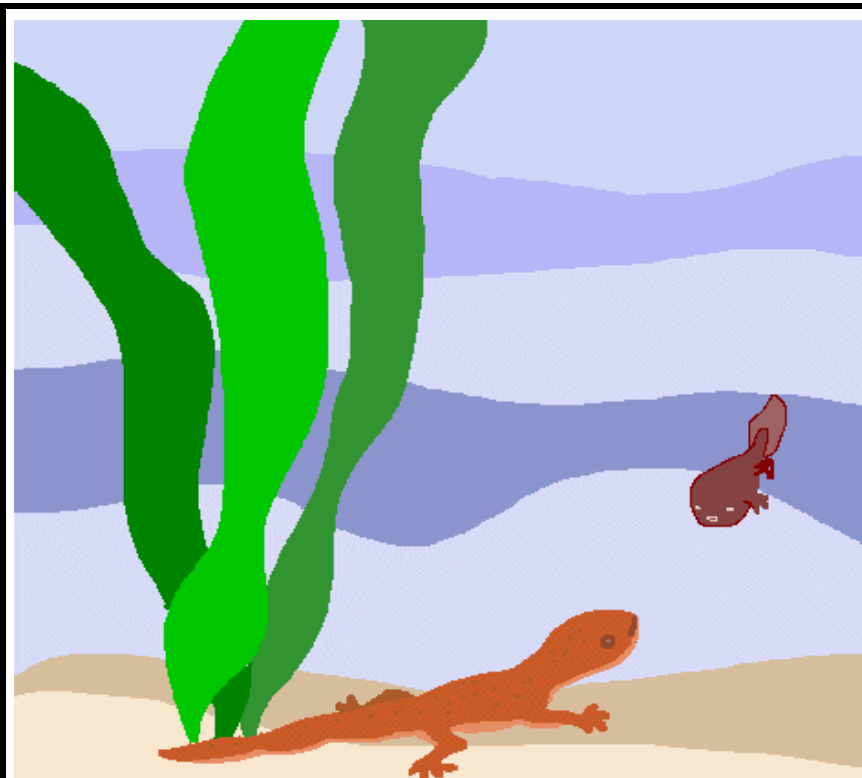

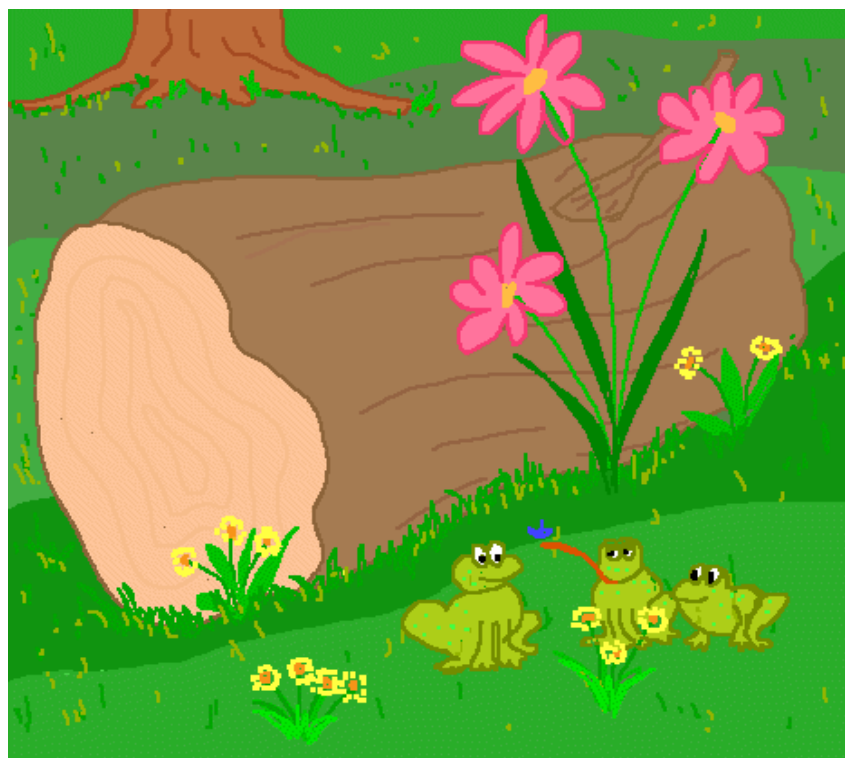
